Stating that students should understand the needs of society, IIT Indore director, Prof Suhas Joshi, asked the new pupils of B Tech to understand their responsibility and come up with innovative ideas and solutions to make their work beneficial to the people.

tively have been offered admission at IIT Indore for academic year 2022-23 (Autumn Semester). Prof Suhas Joshi, director, congratulated all the newly joined students and addressed the community.
